Getting started

Setup

After unpacking the voice recorder, follow the steps below to have it ready for use.

Step 1	Insert the battery
Step 2	Charge the recorder
Step 3	Turn the power ON
Step 4	Setting the date/time Set the voice recorder's clock for use with file management.
Step 5	Setting the voice guidance



Remove the screen protector on the display.


Before using the voice recorder, remove the battery from the bag and insert it in the battery compartment.

1 To open the battery cover, slide the battery cover lock release lever in the direction of the arrow.



With the label on the back facing up, align the terminals on the recorder and the battery, and then press down in at (A) and set the battery into place by pressing it inward at (B).





As shown, set the battery pack so that it tucks under the protruding section of the recorder.

3 Slide the battery cover until it is completely closed.

NOTE

- Be sure to firmly close the battery cover (slide until the battery cover lock clicks).
- Do not close the battery cover if the battery is not completely inserted.
- Check for any metallic foreign matter or dust on the terminal of the battery.
- Do not use a battery other than that specified.

Charging the battery by connecting to an AC adapter with a USB connection (model A514)

The battery can be recharged by connecting the recorder to the provided AC adapter (A514). It is recommended to use the AC adapter when using the recorder for a long period of time, such as for long recordings.


NOTE

- Lithium-ion batteries are self-discharging. Be sure to charge the battery before you start recording.
- Before connecting the USB connector, release HOLD mode (№ P.23).
- 1 Connect the USB connection cable to the USB connector on the AC adapter.


Connect the USB cable to the AC adapter.



Connect the AC adapter to an AC power outlet.



While the recorder is in stop mode or the recorder's power is OFF, connect the USB connection cable to the recorder's USB terminal.



Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select [AC Adapter].

Charging the battery by connecting to an AC adapter with a USB connection (model A514)

- Press the ▶ 0K button to start charging.
- 6 Charging has finished when the battery indicator changes to [].



Charging time: About 3 hours*

- Approximate time needed to fully charge a completely flat battery at room temperature.
 - The charging time depends on the amount of remaining power and the state of the battery.

NOTE


 Use only the Olympus USB connecting AC adapter model provided (A514). Charging the battery by connecting to a PC's USB connector

NOTE

- Before connecting the USB connector, release HOLD mode (RP P.23).
- 1 Start the PC.
- Connect the USB connection cable to the USB port on the PC.



While the recorder is in stop mode or the recorder's power is OFF, connect the USB connection cable to the recorder's USB terminal.



Charging the battery by connecting to a PC's USB connector

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select [PC].





- Press the ► 0K button to start charging.
- 6 Charging is finished when [Battery full] appears.




NOTE

- The power of PC must be ON to charge the battery using the USB connector. You cannot charge the battery when the power of PC is OFF, or the PC is in standby, sleep or auto power OFF mode.
- Do not use a USB hub when charging the battery by connecting to the PC.
- When []¹¹ or [] is displayed the battery cannot be charged. Charge the battery in an ambient temperature of between 5 and 35°C (41 and 95°F).
 - *1 (a): Ambient temperature is too
 - *2 [H]: Ambient temperature is too high
- If battery life has become noticeably short on a full charge, replace the battery with a new one.
- Insert the USB connector securely all the way. Operation will not be normal if the connection is not made properly.
- Use only a compatible Olympus USB extension cable. Operation is not guaranteed if another manufacturer's cable is used. Only use the Olympus USB extension cable with the voice recorder and never use if a product from another manufacturer is used.
- Selecting [AC Adapter] when the AC adapter is connected will enable you to charge the battery with [USB Settings] set to [Composite] (© P.83).

Turn the power ON

While the voice recorder is turned off, slide the POWER/HOLD switch in the direction of the arrow.



NOTE

 Always charge a rechargeable battery before using it for the first time (ESP P.13).

Setting the date/time

- The voice recognition function can be used in this setting (1887 P.31).
- Press the ►►I or I◄ button to select the item to set.





Press the ▲ or ▼ button to change the number.





- To change the setting of another item, press the ► or I ◄ button to move the blinking cursor, then press the ▲ or ▼ button to change the number.
- Press the ▶ 0K button to finalize the setting.

Setup

- If you press the **OK** button during the setup operation, the recorder will save the items that were set to that point.
- You can change the clock display format. See "Setting the date/time [Time & Date]" (** P.82) for the procedure.

Setting the voice guidance

This feature gives voice announcements of recorder operating conditions.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select [0n] or [0ff].





[**On**]: Voice guidance will be enabled. [**Off**]: Guidance will be canceled.

Press the ▶OK button to finalize the setting.



TIP

• [On/Off], [Speed], and [Volume] can be set for the voice guidance. See "Setting the voice guidance [Voice Guide]" (** P.99) for the procedure.

Batteries

Rechargeable batteries

Read the information below carefully when using a lithium-ion rechargeable battery (Li-50B)

Discharging

Rechargeable batteries discharge naturally when not in use. Be sure to charge the battery before use.

Operating temperature

Rechargeable batteries are chemical-based products. Their performance can vary even when used within the recommended operating temperature range. This variation is normal.

■ Recommended temperature range

When powering voice recorder: 0 to 42°C (32 to 107.6°F)

When being charged: 5 to 35°C (41 to 95°F) During long-term storage: -20 to 30°C (-4 to 86°F)

Use of a rechargeable battery outside the temperature ranges above may result in drops in battery performance or life. When not using the voice recorder for an extended period, remove the rechargeable battery before storage to prevent fluid leakage or rust.

NOTE

· Due to the nature of a lithium-ion rechargeable battery, new batteries and batteries not used for an extended period (one month or more) may not charge completely. The battery should become fully charged after charging and discharging the battery up to three times.

- Always dispose rechargeable batteries in the legally prescribed manner. Before disposing rechargeable batteries that are not fully discharged, take steps to prevent shorting such as insulating their terminals with tape.
- Always turn power off before replacing. the battery. Files may be damaged if the battery is removed while the voice recorder is recording or performing an operation such as erasing a file.
- At the time of purchase, the battery cover is not attached to the device.
- You may need to reset the date/time if the battery is removed from the voice recorder for over fifteen minutes, or if the battery is quickly removed and replaced. See "Setting the date/time [Time & Date]" (ISS P.82) for the procedure.
- When not using the voice recorder for an extended period, always remove the battery before storage.
- When buying rechargeable batteries. always select lithium-ion rechargeable batteries (Li-50B). Operation is not guaranteed. If a battery from another manufacturer is used.
- Even if the battery indicator is [...]. playback with the built-in speaker at some volumes may result in a drop in battery output voltage, causing the voice recorder to reset. Lower the volume in this case.
- Battery life will be shorter when using an SD card.
- The continuous battery usage time will vary depending on the performance of the battery in use (P.145).
- Battery life will be shorter when using lithium-ion rechargeable battery that has been used repeatedly (RPP.145).

For customers in Germany:

Olympus has an agreement with the GRS (Joint Battery Disposal Association) in Germany to ensure environmentally-friendly battery disposal.

Battery indicator

As the battery loses its remaining charge, the battery indicator on the display changes as follows:




• Indicates there is little remaining battery charge. Charge the battery. When the battery has run out, I and [Battery low] appears, operation stops.


The voice recorder has its own internal memory, and also supports standard SD cards (SD, SDHC, and SDXC) sold separately.

Inserting an SD card

While the voice recorder is in stop mode, open the card cover.



Insert an SD card, making sure it is placed correctly as shown.



- Insert the SD card straight, avoiding crooked insertion.
- Inserting an SD card the wrong way or crookedly could damage its contact surface or cause it to jam in the slot.
- An SD card not inserted fully (until it clicks into place) might not record data.

- 3 Close the card cover.
 - When you insert an SD card, the recording media selection screen will appear.
- To record onto the SD card, press the ▲ or ▼ button and select [Yes].





Press the ▶ **0**K button to finalize the setting.





TIP

 You can also select the internal memory as the recording media (*** P.82).

Inserting an SD card

NOTE

 The voice recorder may not be able to recognize an SD card formatted (initialized) for a PC or other device.
 Before using an SD card, always initialize it on the voice recorder (*** P.101).

SD cards

You cannot perform recording or erasing if the write protect switch is set to the [LOCK] side.



Removing an SD card

- While the voice recorder is in stop mode, open the card cover.
- Release the SD card by pressing it inward, then letting it slowly return.



- The SD card moves outward and stops. Pull the SD card out with your fingertips.
- [Internal memory selected] is displayed after removing an SD card, if [Memory Select] was set to [SD card].



3 Close the card cover.

NOTE

 SD cards may pop out forcefully on removal if you flick or release your finger too quickly after pressing the SD card in.

Removing an SD card

- Depending on the card's manufacturer and type, some SD cards, SDHC cards, and SDXC cards may not be fully compatible with the voice recorder and not be recognized properly.
- For SD card compatibility under Olympus verification, please contact our customer support at:

http://www.olympus-europa.com Note that our customer support will provide information on SD card manufacturers and card types for which Olympus has verified operation, but will not guarantee it's performance. Also note that some cards may no longer be recognized correctly by the voice recorder in case card manufacturer changes card specifications.


- Read the operating instructions provided with the card when using an SD card.
- If an SD card is not recognized by the voice recorder, try removing and reinserting the card to have the voice recorder attempt recognition again.
- Processing speed may be low for some SD card types. Processing performance may also be reduced by writing or deleting data repeatedly from an SD card. In such a case, initialize the SD card (**P.101).

Preventing accidental operation

Setting the voice recorder to HOLD mode maintains the current operation and disables button operations. HOLD mode is a handy feature for preventing unintentional operation from accidental button presses when the voice recorder is carried in a bag or pocket. It is also useful for preventing the voice recorder being accidentally stopped during recording.

Setting HOLD mode

Slide the POWER/HOLD switch to the [HOLD] position.



 [Hold] appears in the display, and the recorder enters HOLD mode.

Releasing HOLD mode

Slide the **POWER/HOLD** switch to position (A) shown below.



NOTE

- If you press any button when the unit is in hold status, the LED indicator light flashes in blue but nothing happens.
- Setting HOLD mode during voice recorder playback (or recording) continues the playback (or recording) operation and prevents any other operation from being performed (the voice recorder stops when playback ends, or recording stops when there is no more available memory).

Turning the power OFF

Existing data, mode settings and the clock setting are saved when the power is turned OFF.

Slide the POWER/HOLD switch in the direction of the arrow for at least one second.



 The playback stop position at power OFF is stored in the memory.

TIP

• Turning the power OFF whenever the voice recorder is not in use minimizes battery consumption.

Power Save mode

When the voice recorder has been stopped for at least 10 minutes (default setting) after power ON, the display disappears and the voice recorder automatically enters the Power Save mode (ESP P.82).

• To release the Power Save mode, turn the power ON again.

[Home] screen operations

Selecting the mode

The [Home] screen is displayed when the recorder power is turned ON.

The [**Home**] screen is how you access available functions, such as voice recorder or music player. See the reference page for each function.



The voice recognition function can be used in this setting (FSF P.31).

1 Press the HOME button to display the [Home] screen.





- During recording, the screen does not change to the [Home] screen.
- Press the ▲/V, ►►I or I◄
 button to select the desired mode.





3 Press the ▶OK button.





When [Recorder] is selected:

The mode changes to [Recorder] mode. In this mode can record by using the microphone or you can play files previously recorded to your voice recorder (** P.34, P.42).





Selecting the mode

When [Music] is selected:

The mode changes to [**Music**] mode. In this mode you can play music files transferred to the voice recorder (** P.42).





When [Text Speech] is selected:

The mode changes to [**Text Speech**] mode. In this mode, text files transferred to the recorder are converted into audio files and can be played back (FSP P.42).





When [Scheduler] is selected:

The mode changes to [**Scheduler**] mode and voice memos can be registered on the selected date (*** P.60).





When [DAISY] is selected:

The mode changes to [**DAISY**] mode and DAISY contents transferred to the recorder from Olympus Sonority or CDs can be played back (Far P.42, P.119).






You can record data to the internal memory or SD card. Regardless of the recording media

selected, voice files, music files and content files are sorted and saved in folders using a hierarchical tree structure. The saved files can be resorted in the order you prefer (** P.77).

Folders for voice recordings

Folders


Sound files recorded by the voice recorder are saved in the folders labeled [Folder A] to [Folder E] in the [Recorder] (RECORDER) folder. You can change the name of [Folder A] to [Folder E] (see P.72).



Files and folders placed directly within the [**Recorder**] folder (not within one of the sub-folders) are not displayed by the voice recorder.

Folders for music playback


When music files created using Windows Media Player are transferred to the voice recorder, folders are created automatically for them within the folder for music playback, using the hierarchical structure shown below.



- You can save a total of 999 files and folders to the [Music] folder.
- You can transfer up to 6000 songs to the [Music] folder.

Folders for DAISY playback

When DAISY contents are transferred to the recorder from Olympus Sonority or CDs, folders are created automatically for them within the folder for DAISY playback, using the hierarchical structure shown below






You can transfer up to 100 folders to the [DAISY] folder.

Folder for Text speech playback

Text files transferred to the [**Text Speech**] (**TEXT**) folder of the recorder from a PC can be converted into audio files to be played back



- You can transfer up to 100 files to the [Text Speech] folder.
- You can play back files of maximum 10 MB in [Text Speech] mode.

Folder for Text speech playback

When transferring a text file (html, doc. docx) to the recorder from a PC, the following file is automatically created with a different name in the same folder.

Example: When "job report_001.html" is transferred to the recorder

- 1 job report_001_main.txt
- ② job report_001_all .txt
- (a) File name:

The same name as the transferred file.

- Read aloud range:
 Added only for html files. Two types of files with " main" and " all" suffixes
- files with "_main" and "_all" suffixes are created automatically.
- © Extension:

The extension is always "txt".



Selecting folders and files

You can select a different folder while the voice recorder is in stop mode or playing a file. See "Folders" (** P.27) for a description of the voice recorder's hierarchical folder structure.



→ Forward: ▶ 0K button

Each press of the ►OK button opens the currently selected folder or file in the list, moving forward to the next (lower) level in the folder hierarchy. When a list is displayed, you can perform the same function by pressing the ►►I button.

Return: F1 (BACK/LIST) button

Each press of the F1 (BACK/LIST) button moves back to the previous (higher) level in the folder hierarchy. When a list is displayed, you can perform the same function by pressing the I◀◀ button.

▲ or ▼ button

Used to select a folder or file.

HOME button

Return to the [Home] screen.

[Home] screen:

Used to select the voice recorder mode (RP P.25).

List display:

Displays the folders and files recorded in the voice recorder.

File display:

Displays the information of the selected file.

Using Voice Recognition

This recorder is equipped with a voice recognition function. This function allows you to perform actions, such as making the date and time settings and changing folder names, automatically just by speaking into the built-in microphone and without any complicated key input. While the recorder is in stop mode, you can also switch to each mode or access a setting item in a menu using voice recognition.

The voice recognition function can be used when setting up functions which have a [3] mark in this manual


Switching the mode

This function can be used when in [Home], [Menu], [Recorder], [Music], [DAISY], [Text Speech], or [Scheduler] mode.

- 1 While the recorder is in stop mode, press and hold the SCENE/VOICE button.
- 2 Say the mode to which you want to switch directly into the built-in microphone.



Accessing menus

This function can be used when in [Home], [Recorder], [Music], [DAISY], [Text Speech], or [Scheduler] mode.

- While the recorder is in stop mode, press and hold the SCENE/ VOICE button.
- 2 Say the desired setting item directly into the built-in microphone.



Release the SCENE/VOICE button.

3 Release the SCENE/VOICE button.

Entering the time and date

Operate while the screen for date and time setting is displayed.

- While the recorder is in stop mode, press and hold the SCENE/ VOICE button.
- 2 Say the year, month, day, and the time you want to set directly into the built-in microphone.


When setting the hour, minute, year, month, and day in the [Time & Date] settings, say the year, month and day or time you want to enter. [Time & Date] Example: (12 P.16, When entering February 10, 2014 P.82) 10:20 AM 2014 February 10th, AM 10:20 When setting the time in [Timer Rec] or [Alarm], say the time you want to set. [Timer Rec] Example: (FF P.89) When the start time is 10:30 [Alarm] (FF P.63) 10:30 AM

3 Release the SCENE/VOICE button.

Changing the folder name

Operate while setting [Folder Name].

- 1 While the recorder is in stop mode, press and hold the SCENE/ VOICE button.
- 2 Say a word related to a setting directly into the built-in microphone.



Release the SCENE/VOICE button.

Using Voice Recognition

TIP

 The recognition rate may be affected by the pronunciation or tone of the speaker. Speak clearly and slowly.

NOTE

- Voice recognition functions cannot be used while the recorder is in playback mode or recording mode. Operate while the recorder is in stop mode.
- Voice recognition may be difficult in environments with a lot of ambient noise. Use this function in quiet environments.

Recording

The voice recorder has five folders ((a) to (b)) in which recorded files can be saved. These folders provide a handy way to sort recordings into separate categories (such as business and leisure).

Basic recording procedure

- On the [Home] screen, press the △, ▼, ▶▶I or I◀◀ button, to select [Recorder], then press the ▶ OK button (☞ P.25).
- Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the desired recording folder.
 - The newly recorded sound is saved in the selected folder.
- Point the built-in microphone in the direction of the sound to record.



4 Press the REC (●) button to start recording.

1 Date recorded

Indicates the year, month and day the recording was made.

2 File number

Appended file numbers are consecutive regardless of whether the recording media has been switched.

3 Extension

A file extension indicating the recording format the file was recorded in by the voice recorder.

- Linear PCM format: ".WAV"
- MP3 format: ".MP3"
- WMA format: ".WMA"

TIP

- [**Rec Mode**] must be set with the voice recorder stopped (FSP P.70).
- Pressing the REC (•) button while [Recorder] is selected on the [Home] screen will allow you to start recording. The recorded file will be saved to [Folder A].

NOTE

- To prevent the beginning of the recording being cut off, start recording after the LED indicator light has lit or mode indicator has appeared in the display.
- When the remaining possible recording time is 60 seconds, the LED indicator light starts flashing. It flashes more rapidly as the remaining time decreases (at the 30- and 10-second points).
- When [Folder full] appears, no more recording can be done. To record more, you will need to select a different folder or delete unneeded files (** P.56).
- If [Memory full] appears, the voice recorder has no more available memory space. You will need to delete unneeded files to record more (xar P.56).
- When using an SD card in the voice recorder, be sure the desired recording media setting ([Internal memory] or [SD card]) has been selected (ar P.82).
- If a folder other than folders to is selected when the REC () button is pressed, the blinking message [Cannot record in this folder] appears. Redo the recording operation after selecting one of folders to .
- It's recommended to initialize the recording media before making an important recording.
- Processing performance may be reduced when data has been repeatedly written to or deleted from the recording media. Please initialize the recording media in this case (## P.101).

Recording linear PCM format data over 2 GB

When recording a linear PCM format file, recording will continue even after the file size exceeds 2 GB.

- The data is divided and saved in separate files of up to 2 GB. The files are processed as multiple files during playback.
- After recording 999 files which exceed 2GB recording stops.

Pausing/resuming recording

Press the REC (●) button during recording.





- Recording pauses, and [indicator appears in the display.
- Recording is stopped automatically after being paused for at least 120 minutes
- Press the REC (●) button again while recording is paused.
 - Recording resumes from the position it was paused at.

Monitoring while recording

You can monitor the recording as you are making it by listening on the earphone plugged into the voice recorder's **EAR** jack. Use the +/- button to adjust the recording monitor volume.

1 Connect the earphones to the voice recorder's EAR jack.



 Changing the volume will not affect the recording level.

NOTE

- To avoid unpleasantly loud sound, set the volume to [00] before plugging in the earphone.
- To prevent feedback, do not place the earphone near the microphone while recording.
- Battery life depletes quickly while recordings are monitored. To conserve battery life, leave the earphone disconnected while recording, or set [Rec Monitor] to [Off] before starting to record.

Recording settings

Various recording settings are available, letting you tailor recording to different recording conditions.

[Low Cut Filter] (158° P.71)	Reduces humming sounds from equipment such as air-conditioners or projectors.	
[Timer Rec] (ESF P.89)	Sets the content such as date and time to schedule a recording.	
[Folder Name] (© P.72)	You can change the names of Folder A to Folder E to names provided in a template beforehand.	
[Rec Monitor] (rs P.72)	Selects whether or not to output the recording monitor sound from the EAR jack.	

Recording with an external microphone

Recording with an external microphone

You can record audio input using an external microphone or other device connected to the voice recorder's microphone jack. Do not plug or unplug devices into voice recorder jacks while recording.

1 Connect an external microphone to the voice recorder's MIC jack.



NOTE

- Connecting an external microphone to the voice recorder's MIC jack disables the built-in microphone.
- Microphones with plug-in power supplies can be used.
- When [Rec Mode] is set to stereo, recording with an external mono microphone records on the left channel only (** P.70).
- When [Rec Mode] is set to mono, only the input from the left channel microphone is recorded when using an external stereo microphone (** P.70).

2 Start recording.

 See "Recording" (P.34) for descriptions of recording operations.

TIP

See "Accessories (optional)"
 (see P.130) for the compatible external microphones.

Recording from another connected device

Recording audio from another device with this recorder

Audio can be recorded when you have connected the audio output terminal (earphone jack) of another device and the MIC jack of the recorder using the connecting cord KA333 (optional) for dubbing.

To MIC jack To audio output terminal of other device

NOTE

 When recording from a connected external device, perform a test recording and adjust the output level of the connected device as needed.

Recording audio from this recorder with another device

Audio from this recorder can be recorded to another device by connecting the audio input terminal (microphone jack) of the other device and the **EAR** jack of this recorder using the connecting cord KA333 (optional).



NOTE

 When you adjust various playback sound quality settings of the recorder, the signals output from the EAR jack change as well (** P.73).

Changing the recording scene [Rec Scene]

Changing the recording scene

The voice recorder has preregistered templates of optimum settings tailored to various recording applications such as lectures and dictation. When selecting one of these templates you can enter several settings recommended for your recording application all in a single operation.



The voice recognition function can be used in this setting (RP.31).

While the voice recorder is in stop mode, press the SCENE/VOICE button.





Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the desired recording scene.





TIP

- Press the F3 (DETAILS) button to check the settings for the selected template. Press the F1 (BACK) button to return to [Rec Scene] screen.
- Press the ▶OK button to finalize the setting.





Skipping to the beginning of the previous file

- 1 Press the I◀◀ button when the playback position is the beginning of the file.
 - To skip to the beginning of the previous file during playback, press the
 I◄◀ button twice consecutively.

NOTE

- If an index mark or temp mark is reached when skipping to the beginning of a file during playback, playback starts from the position of the mark. When skipping to the beginning of a file while the voice recorder is in stop mode, the mark is ignored (*** P.53).
- If a setting other than [File Skip] is set for [Skip Space], playback starts after the set amount of time has been skipped backwards or forwards. Playback does not skip to the beginning of the file.

Music files

If a music file transferred to the voice recorder is unplayable, check that its sampling rate, bit count and bit rate values are within the supported ranges. The sampling rate, bit count and bit rate combinations supported for music file playback by the voice recorder are shown below.

File format	Sampling rate	Bit count/bit rate
WAV format	44.1 kHz, 48 kHz	16 bits
MP3 format	MPEG 1 Layer 3: 32 kHz, 44.1 kHz, 48 kHz MPEG 2 Layer 3: 16 kHz, 22.05 kHz, 24 kHz	8 to 320 kbps
WMA format	8 kHz, 11 kHz, 16 kHz, 22 kHz, 32 kHz, 44.1 kHz, 48 kHz	5 to 320 kbps

- MP3 files with variable bit rates (bit rates converted variably in a single file) may not play normally.
- Linear PCM-format WAV files are the only WAV files the voice recorder can play. Playback of other WAV files is not supported.
- Even if the file formats is compatible for playback on this recorder, the recorder does not support every encoder.

Changing the playback speed

You can change the playback speed. Changing the playback speed is handy for speeding up conference presentations, or for slowing down parts difficult to discern when learning a language. You can set the playback speed from 50% (slow) to 100% (normal) to 600% (fast).

Press the ▶OK button during playback.





Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the desired playback speed.





3 Press the ▶OK button.



TIP

 When changing the playback speed, playback operations such as stopping playback, skipping to the beginning of a file, and writing index marks/temp marks are the same as during standard playback.


NOTE

- Altered playback speed settings are retained even after power OFF.
- During playback of a file, the [Speed] (© P.99) setting of [Voice Guide] is disabled

Fast playback restrictions

Depending on their sampling rate and bit rate, some files may not play normally. In this case you will need to reduce the playback speed in this case. The voice recorder has a function that lets you repeat the playback of a portion (segment) of the file being played. In addition to the A-B repeat function available from previous models, the segment to repeat can be changed during repeat playback.

ABC repeat playback



- 1 Select the starting point for repeat playback (A) during playback.
- ② When the ending point (B) is selected, repeat playback starts.
- ③ When the starting point for repeat playback (A) is canceled during repeat playback, the ending point of the segment (B) becomes the new starting point and playback continues.
- (4) When the ending point (C) is selected, repeat playback starts again.
- (5) These steps can be repeated to respecify a new segment to be played back repeatedly up to the end of the file.

- Select a file for ABC repeat playback, and start playback.
- Press the F3 (ABC) button when playback reaches the desired start position for ABC repeat playback.





TIP

 You can change the playback speed ([®] P.47), and fastforward/rewind ([®] P.44) when the [1] indicator is blinking.

ABC repeat playback

- If playback reaches the end of the file when the [1] indicator is blinking, the end of the file is treated as the segment end position, and repeat playback starts.
- Press the F3 (SET B) button again when playback reaches the desired end position for ABC repeat playback.





Segment A-B is set, and ABC repeat playback starts.

- You cannot change the end position of a repeat playback segment to a position before the start position.
- You cannot write index marks or temp marks during ABC repeat playback (*** P.53).
- You cannot use the ABC repeat function for DAISY contents or text files.

Canceling ABC repeat playback

1 Press the F2 (CNCL ABC) button.



- If pressed when ABC repeat playback is stopped, cancels ABC repeat playback.
- If pressed during ABC repeat playback, cancels the playback segment setting for the function, and continues standard playback.

NOTE

 If you change the file or switch to different display screen, ABC repeat playback is canceled.

Using the Bookmark Function

The recorder has a bookmark function that automatically stores the last position it was stopped for each file.

Storing the position in the file when it was stopped



NOTE

- If an index mark is reached when skipping to the beginning of a file during playback, playback starts from the position of the mark. When skipping to the beginning of a file while the voice recorder is in stop mode, the mark is ignored (EW P.53).
- DAISY contents skip in accordance with the skip intervals set in [Skip Mode] of [Book Menu] (P.87).
- You cannot skip to the beginning in text files.
- Text files skip in clause units.
- When files are deleted on the recorder, the Bookmark Position information is deleted as well.

Index marks/temp marks

Writing an index mark or temp mark in a file enables you to quickly access desired position in the file with the same operations used for fast-forwarding, rewinding or skipping to the start of a file. Index marks are added to the files created using Olympus voice recorders and temp marks are added to files created using other devices. The position you wish to start listening from can be temporarily stored in a file during playback.

- [DAISY] mode has a bookmark with the same functions as an index mark.
- Index marks cannot be set in [Text Speech] mode.

Writing an index mark/temp mark

1 At the position to add an index mark or temp mark, press the F2 (INDEX) button.





NOTE

- Temp marks are temporary markings.
 They are automatically erased when you select a different file, transfer the file to a PC, or move the file on a PC.
- You can write up to 99 index marks/ temp marks in a single file. The message (No more can be set) appears if you attempt to write more than 99 marks
- You cannot write or erase index marks/temp marks in files that have been locked by the file lock function (** P.77).

Erasing an index mark/temp mark

- 1 Select a file that contains index mark/temp mark you want to erase and start playback.
- 2 Use the ▶►I or I◀◀ button to select the index mark/temp mark you want to erase.





- When the number of the index mark/temp mark to erase is being shown (for about 2 seconds) in the display, press the ERASE button.
 - Any subsequent index marks/temp marks in the file are automatically renumbered.

Using the Calendar Search function to search for a file

You can search for voice files by specifying a recording date. If you have forgotten in which folder a file has been saved, this feature lets you access it quickly by entering its recording date.

Partially erasing files

You can erase unneeded parts of a file.



You can only partially erase PCM format files recorded using this recorder.

- Play back a file you wish to partially erase.
 - Advance the file to the position you wish to erase. If the file is long, use the ►►I button to advance to the position where you wish to erase.
- Press the ERASE button at the partial erase start position.





 Playback continues while [Partial Erase] is flashing and as with usual playback, fast-forward/rewind can be performed and you can quickly advance to the end position. When the end of the file is reached while the display is flashing, that position becomes the end position of erase.

Partially erasing files

Press the ERASE button again at the position where you wish to end partial erase.





On the display, [Start point] and [End point] flashes alternately.

NOTE

- Files cannot be restored after being erased, so please check carefully before erasing a file.
- In [Text Speech] mode, if you erase the text file generated during the file transfer, the original file (html, doc, docx) will also be removed.
- When the SD card is set to writeprotected, [SD Card Protected] is displayed. To erase files, cancel SD card write protection (see P.21).
- When an SD card is inserted in the recorder, be sure to confirm that the recording media used is the [Internal memory] or [SD card] so there is no mistake about where files are stored (mar P.82).
- Locked files and read-only files cannot be erased (™ P.77).
- You cannot erase [Recorder] ([Folder A] to [Folder E]), [Music], [DAISY] and [Text Speech] folders, which are preset in the recorder.
- [Music] folder subfolders other than the [Music] can be erased.
- [**Text Speech**] folder subfolders other than the [**Text Speech**] can be erased.
- If there is a file that cannot be recognized by the recorder, the file and the folder which contains that file will not be erased. The voice recorder must be connected to a PC to erase these files and folders.

Partially erasing files

- Before erasing a file or folder, charge or replace the battery to ensure it will not run out before the process has finished. Erasing processes can take over 10 seconds to complete. To prevent the risk of damage to data, never attempt to perform any of the following processes before an erasing process has finished:
 - 1 Disconnecting the AC adapter
 - (2) Removing the battery
 - ③ Removing the SD card (if the recording media has been set to [SD card].)

Schedule

Displaying the schedule screen

Operating the schedule screen

This recorder has a voice memo function that allows you to record a one-minute voice memo on a specified date and time.

Because the voice memo is played at a specified day and time, it can be used to help manage vour schedule.

- Press the **HOME** button to display the [Home] screen.
- Press the ▼ button to select [Scheduler].





Press the ▶ 0K button.





• The mark is displayed on dates where a memo or schedule recording is registered.

Press the \triangle , ∇ , $\triangleright \triangleright$ or $| \blacktriangleleft \triangleleft$ button to move the cursor.



- (a) Preset ON/OFF: Set whether to execute the set content.

Setting ON/OFF:

[**ON**]: Executes the set content. [**OFF**]: Does not execute the set content.

Setting the execution time:



The voice recognition function can be used in this setting (1887 P.31).

- ① Press the ▲ or ▼ button to change the number.

Setting the starting time to play back the voice memo

- 3 Repeat steps 1 and 2 to set the execution time.
- Press the F3 (G0) button to complete the setting.

Alarm playback

The alarm sounds when the set time arrives. While the alarm is sounding, press the ▶OK button to play the preset voice memo. Press the STOP (■) button to stop playback.

TIP

- The alarm stops automatically in five minutes if the button is not pressed.
 At that time, the voice memo is not played.
- Even though the power is OFF or the unit is in HOLD mode, the alarm sounds when the set alarm time arrives. Even when in HOLD mode, pressing the
 OK button starts playback of the set voice memo.
- The volume of the alarm sound is controlled by the volume setting [Beep] (ISS P.80).

NOTE

- Alarm playback does not operate if the recorder is operated at the set alarm playback time or the recorder is operating at that time.
- When the timer record and start time setting are the same, the timer recording setting takes precedence (© P.89).

Erasing a voice memo

Erasing a voice memo

You can erase voice memos. You can erase voice memos one at a time or collectively.

- Select the voice memo you wish to erase (☞ P.62).
- 2 Press the ERASE button.





3 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the erase mode.





[**One file**]: Erases the selected voice memo.

[One day]: Erases all voice memos that are registered on the same date as the selected voice memo.

[**One month**]: Erases all voice memos that are registered in the same month as the selected voice memo.

[**All files**]: Erases all voice memos registered in the recorder.

- A message indicating the setting has been entered appears.
- If you press the I◀■ button without pressing the ►OK button, the setting is canceled and the previous screen is displayed.

 When you enter the menu screen during recording or playback, press the F1 (BACK) button to return to the previous screen without interrupting recording or playback.

NOTE

- For menu settings done while the voice recorder is in stop mode, the voice recorder exits the menu and returns to the stopped mode if no operation is performed for 3 minutes. The selected setting item is not changed in this case.
- For menu settings done during recording/playback, the voice recorder exits the menu if no operation is performed for 8 seconds.

Selecting the recording sensitivity [Rec Level]

You can change the recording level (sensitivity) as needed for your recording application.

[High]:

The highest recording sensitivity. Suited to recording lectures, large conferences and other applications with distant or quiet sound sources.

[Middle]:

Suitable for recording in a meeting with a small number of people.

[Low]:

The lowest sensitivity, this level is suitable for dictation.

[Manual]:

You can adjust the recording to any of 30 levels.

TIP

 When you wish to record a speaking voice clearly, set [Rec Level] to [Low], and place the voice recorder's built-in microphone near the speaker's mouth (5 to 10 cm away).

NOTE

 When [Rec Level] is set to [High], [Middle] or [Low], the recording level is adjusted automatically. Excessively loud sound input may generate noise regardless of whether [Rec Level] is set to [High], [Middle] or [Low].

Adjusting the recording level

1 Adjust the recording level by pressing the ►►I or I◄◀ button during recording or when recording is paused.





 Increasing the [Rec Level] number increases the recording level and extends the level meter indicator position.

NOTE

 Setting the voice recorder to [Manual] disables the limiter function. If [OVER] is displayed, the recorded audio will be distorted. Adjust the recording level so that [OVER] is not displayed.

Setting the recording mode [Rec Mode]

You can prioritize sound quality or recording time. Select the recording mode that best matches your recording application.

[PCM 48 kHz/16bit] [PCM 44.1 kHz/16bit] [MP3 256 kbps] [MP3 128 kbps] [WMA 32 kbps mono]* [WMA 8 kbps mono]*

* Mono recording

TIP

- The [Rec Mode] screen shows the highest sound quality order, beginning from the top.
- Setting a higher recording rate increases file size. Check that you have enough remaining memory before recording.
- To record conferences and presentations clearly, it is recommended to set [Rec Mode] setting to [MP3 128kbps] or above.

NOTE

 When [Rec Mode] is set to stereo, recording with a connected mono microphone records on the left channel only.

Selecting microphone directivity [Zoom Mic]

The voice recorder's built-in stereo microphone provides directivity ranging from broad-coverage stereo recording to highly directional recording.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to adjust the directionality of the built-in stereo microphone.





- The + button increases directivity.
- The button enables recordings with broader-coverage stereo.
- Reducing directivity and broadening the sound pickup range gives recordings more of a stereo effect.
- You can adjust the range between [-3] and [+6].

Zoom mic function







Narrow sound pickup range



NOTE

- The [Zoom Mic] function is designed to demonstrate the performance by the recorder's built-in stereo microphone Note that normal recording may no longer be possible when using a separately purchased microphone or when recording from another device using a connecting cord.
- The following function is not available when the [Zoom Mic] function is used.
 - [With recording] (FSF P.92)

Reducing noise during recording [Low Cut Filter]

The voice recorder's low cut filter function lets you make recordings that reduce humming sounds from air-conditioners or low-frequency sounds from equipment such as projectors.

[On]:

Turns the low cut filter ON.

[Off]:

The low cut filter is disabled

Setting timer recording [Timer Rec]

Recording starts automatically when the set time arrives

See "Setting timer recording [Timer Rec]" (FF P.89) for the procedure.

Changing the folder name [Folder Name]

You can change the name [**Folder A**] to [**Folder E**] for voice recording.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the folder you wish to change.





Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the name you wish to change from the registered list.



The voice recognition function can be used in this setting (FP P.31).

TIP

 In addition to navigating through the menu, you can press the F3 button on the folder list display screen to change the folder names.

Setting the recording monitor [Rec Monitor]

Select whether or not to output audio while recording from the earphone jack (**EAR**).

[On]:

Enables the recording monitor function. Sound will be output from the **EAR** iack.

Off:

Disables this function. Sound will not be output from the **EAR** jack.

NOTE

 If the external speaker is connected while recording, there is a risk that audio feedback will occur. It is recommended that you use earphones to monitor recording, or turn [Rec Monitor] to [Off] while recording.

Playback menu [Play Menu]

Skipping non-voice portions during playback [Voice Playback]

The [Voice Playback] function lets you only play the speaking portions of a recorded file of spoken-word content.

NOTE

• The speaking portions of the file must be extracted beforehand (** P.92).

[On]:

Automatically skips the non-voice portions of the file and plays only the speaking portions.

[Off]:

The voice playback function is disabled.

NOTE

 The [Voice Playback] function is only enabled in [Recorder] mode.

Reducing noise during playback [Noise Cancel]

Use the [Noise Cancel] function to reduce noise when a recorded voice is difficult to discern.

[High] [Low]:

Reduces surrounding noise to play back clearer sound quality.

[**Off**]: The noise cancel function is disabled.

NOTE

 The [Noise Cancel] function is only enabled in [Recorder] mode.

Adjusting low volume portions during playback [Voice Balancer]

The [Voice Balancer] function adjusts low-volume portions of recorded audio files to make them louder.

[On]:

Adjusts low-volume portions of audio files during playback, making them louder.

[Off]:

The voice balancer function is disabled.

NOTE

 The [Voice Balancer] function is only enabled in [Recorder] mode.

Playback menu [Play Menu]

Selecting playback modes [Play Mode]

Select the playback mode according to your preference.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select [Playback range] or [Repeat].

[Playback range]:

Specifies the range of file playback.

[Repeat]:

Repeats playback of the set range.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the setting.

When [Playback range] was selected: [File] [Folder] [All]:

Specify the range of file playback.

When [Repeat] was selected:

[On]:

Repeats playback of the playback range.

[Off]:

Cancels repeat playback.

NOTE

- When you set [Playback range] to [File], [End] blinks in the display for 2 seconds after the last file in the folder has been played, then playback stops at the start position of the last file.
- While [Playback range] is set to [Folder], [End] blinks in the display for 2 seconds after the last file in the folder has been played, then playback stops at the start position of the first file in the folder.
- When [**Playback range**] is set to [**All**], after the last file in the current folder has been played, the first file in the next folder is being played. When playback reaches the end of the last file in the voice recorder, [**End**] flashes in the display for 2 seconds, then playback stops at the start position of the first file in the voice recorder.

Playback menu [Play Menu]

Setting a skip space [Skip Space]

This function skips (forward) or reverse skips (rewinds) the file being played back for a set amount of time and it is a convenient way to move the playback position or repeat playing a short phrase.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select [Forward Skip] or [Reverse Skip].

[Forward Skip]:

Starts playback after moving the playback position forward by the set amount.

[Reverse Skip]:

Rewinds the set amount of time and starts playback.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the setting.

> When [Forward Skip] was selected: [File Skip], [10 sec. Skip], [30 sec. Skip], [1 min. Skip], [5 min. Skip]

When [Reverse Skip] was selected: [File Skip], [3 sec. Skip], [5 sec. Skip], [10 sec. Skip], [30 sec. Skip], [1 min. Skip], [5 min. Skip]

NOTE

- Forward/reverse skip operations over a skip space that contains an index mark/ temp mark or the starting position of a file will stop at that mark or at the start position.
- The [Skip Space] function is only enabled in [Recorder] mode.

Forward/reverse skip playback

- Press the ►OK button to start playback.
- Press the ▶▶I or I◀◀ button during playback.
 - Playback starts after skipping forward or backward by the set amount.

Increasing efficiency for voice transcription [Transcription Mode]

Changes the operations assigned to the voice recorder's buttons to operations tailored to transcription.

You can change operation of buttons to the setting for transcription.

[Off]:

The operation of buttons becomes normal.

File menu [File Menu]

Extracting the speaking portions of files of spoken-word content [Voice Detect]

The function extracts the speech portions of a voice file or a file being recorded by the voice recorder.

See "Extracting the speaking portions of files of spoken-word content [Voice Detect]" (Fig. P.92) for the procedure.

Preventing accidental file erasure [File Lock]

The file lock feature lets you lock important files to prevent them being accidentally erased. Once locked, a file is not erased even if the operation for erasing all the files in its folder is performed (*** P.S6).

Select the file you want to lock (P.30).

[On]:

Locks the file.

[Off]:

File lock is canceled.

Sorting files [Sort by]

You can collectively change the playback order of files saved in the voice recorder.

[File name]:

Sorts files automatically by name.

[Date ascending]:

Automatically sorts the files by date (recording date/time) from oldest to newest files.

[Date descending]:

Automatically sorts the files by date (recording date/time) from newest to oldest files.

NOTE

 When [File name] is selected, files are listed in order of file name based on the character code

Moving/copying files [Move/Copy]

Files saved in the internal memory or on an SD card can be moved or copied within memory.

See "Moving/copying files [Move/Copy]" (Fig. 19.94) for the procedure.

Dividing files [File Divide]

Large files or files with long recording times can be divided for easier management and editing.

See "**Dividing files [File Divide]**" (1887 P.97) for the procedure.

Displaying file or folder information [Property]

You can display the information of a file or folder from a menu screen.

File information

1 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to switch the screen.

- [Name] [Date] [Size] [Bit Rate]*1
 [Artist]*2 [Album]*2 are displayed.
- *1 When a linear PCM format file is selected, the sampling rate and bit count are displayed in the [Bit Rate] field.
- *2 If there is no tag information in the file, [UNKNOWN_ARTIST] and [UNKNOWN_ALBUM] are displayed.

Folder information

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to switch the screen.

- [Name] [Folder] and [File] are displayed.
- In [Recorder] mode, [Folder] is not displayed.
- Displayed numbers of files do not include files in formats that are unrecognizable to the voice recorder.

Erasing the content folder [Erase app data]

Use the smartphone application (FF P.106) to delete the content folders transferred to the voice recorder.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the folder you wish to erase.





2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select [Start].





NOTE

· You cannot use the voice recorder to check the files in the content folder.

LCD/Sound menu [LCD/Sound Menu]

Setting the backlight [Backlight]

The display backlights are switched on for a preset amount of time when a button operation is performed.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select [Lighting Time], [Dim light time] or [Brightness].

[Lighting Time]:

Set the time between when the backlight is turned ON and the screen display becomes dim.

[Dim light time]:

Set the time between when the screen becomes dim and the screen is turned OFF.

[Brightness]:

Set the brightness of the backlight.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the setting.

When [Lighting Time] is selected: [5 sec.] [10 sec.] [30 sec.] [1 min.] [Always ON]

When [Dim Light time] is selected: [30 sec.] [1 min.] [2 min.] [5 min.] [Always ON]

When [Brightness] is selected: [01] [02] [03]

Setting the LED indicator light [LED]

You can set the unit so that the LED indicator light does not light.

[On]:

LED indicator light is switched on.

[Off]:

The LED indicator does not light.

Turning beeping sound ON/OFF [Beep]

The voice recorder makes beeping sounds when buttons are pressed, or to warn in case of operation errors. You can select whether the voice recorder makes these beeping sounds.

- Select from [5] to [0].
- As greater the number, the louder the beep sound.

NOTE

 The starting tune/closing tune when the power is turned On/Off (** P.16, P.24) can be controlled by the volume setting [Beep].

LCD/Sound menu [LCD/Sound Menu]

Changing the display language [Language]

You can select the language used in the voice recorder's displays.

 [Čeština] [Dansk] [Deutsch] [English] [Español] [Français] [Italiano] [Nederlands] [Polski] [Русский] [Svenska].

TIP

 The language selections vary depending on where the voice recorder was purchased.

Setting the voice guidance [Voice Guide]

This feature gives voice announcements of recorder operating conditions.

See "**Setting the voice guidance** [**Voice Guide**]" (FSP P.99) for the procedure.

Selecting the speaker output [Speaker]

You can set the built-in speaker to be ON or OFF when the earphones are not connected.

[On]:

When the earphone is connected, sound is output from the earphone and when the earphone is disconnected, sound is output from the built-in speaker.

[Off]:

Sound is not output from the built-in speaker even though the earphone is disconnected

Device menu [Device Menu]

Selecting the recording media [Memory Select]

When there is an SD card in the voice recorder, you can select whether to record on the internal memory or on the SD card (ESP. P.20).

[Internal memory]:

Records to internal memory.

[SD card]:

Records to the SD card.

Setting power save mode [Power Save]

The voice recorder turns OFF automatically when a preset amount of time has elapsed while the voice recorder is in stop mode after power ON.

[5 min.] [10 min.] [30 min.] [1 hr.] [2 hr.] [3 hr.]

Select the desired amount of time.


[Off]:

Disables power save mode. Note that leaving the voice recorder On will quickly deplete the battery.

Setting the date/time [Time & Date]

Set the date and time beforehand to enable easier management of recorded files.



 Even if the voice recorder is not used for a long period of time, when the battery is used up, the date and time must be re-entered

Setting the USB connection [USB Settings]

When connecting the voice recorder to a PC, you can use the voice recorder as a USB storage device.

[Storage Class]:

The PC side recognizes the voice recorder as an external storage device.

[Composite]:

When connected to a PC, select to use the voice recorder as an external storage device, USB speaker and microphone.

This setting is used to return various functions to the factory default settings (factory default). The clock setting, file numbers, and folder names are retained.

Formatting a recording media [Format]

Formatting a recording media erases all existing files saved on it. Be sure to transfer all important files to a PC before formatting. See "Formatting a recording media [Format]" (*** P.101) for the procedure.

Checking recording media information [Memory Info.]

You can display the capacity and remaining memory space of the recording media from a menu screen.

NOTE

 Some recording media memory capacity is used as a management area, so the actual usable capacity will always be slightly less than the displayed capacity.

Device menu [Device Menu]

Confirming the voice recorder information [System Info.]

You can display voice recorder information from a menu screen.

 Displays system information about the voice recorder, such as [Model], [Version], and [Serial No.].

Displaying Wi-Fi setting information [Wi-Fi]

Displays information related to Wi-Fi connections with the voice recorder. You can use the voice recorder as an Wi-Fi access point only.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select [Wi-Fi connection] or [Change password].





[Wi-Fi connection]:

Displays the SSID (network name) and password required to use a smartphone to connect to the voice recorder over Wi-Fi. At the same time, displays the QR code that is generated by the displayed SSID and password. To use QR codes, you must install a special application beforehand.

[Change password]:

Select to change the password.
Each time it is executed, a different password is automatically generated. For security reasons, we recommend that you change the password periodically. Running [Reset Settings] (Fig. P.83) restores the password back to default.

To check the default password, use the [Wi-Fi connection] function after using [Reset Settings].

When [Wi-Fi connection] is selected:



- (a) QR code
- b SSID
- © Password
- The QR code, SSID and password are displayed on the screen.

When [Change password] is selected:



When configuring a smartphone:

TIP

 A special application is provided for smartphones. If the special application is installed on your smartphone, you can easily use QR codes to configure the phone (** P.106).

NOTE

- While the Wi-Fi ON/OFF switch is turned ON, the [Power Save] function is disabled.
 If the voice recorder is left in this state, battery life will be consumed quickly.
- While the Wi-Fi ON/OFF switch is turned ON, [Change password] is not available.
 To perform [Change password], turn OFF the Wi-Fi ON/OFF switch
- When Wi-Fi is connected, battery life is shorter. If the battery runs out during data transfer, the data may be damaged. Therefore, when using a Wi-Fi connection we recommend that you use the AC adapter included with the voice recorder.
- Operation of the Wi-Fi ON/OFF switch is disabled during recording. Perform switch operations while recording is stopped.

Book menu [Book Menu]

Skipping in hierarchical units [Skip Mode]

DAISY contents are divided in units of chapters, sections, paragraphs and pages, and it is possible to jump quickly from one location to another

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the skip mode.

[Section]*:

Indicates chapters, sections, paragraphs, etc. in DAISY contents.

Example: [Level 1] is equivalent to chapters, [Level 2] is equivalent to sections and [Level 3] is equivalent to paragraphs.

[Group]:

A portion within a section is called a "Group". Groups can be set at the beginning and/or end of diagram explanations.

[Pages]:

Equivalent to a page in a book.

[Sentence]:

When reading a text aloud, there are breathing intervals between sentences. The audio between this interval and the next interval is called a "Sentence"

[Phrase]:

Equivalent to phrases and idioms.

[Bookmark]:

Indicates a location where an index mark (bookmark) is set.

* Choose from skip levels [Level 1] to [Level 6] when you select [Section].

NOTE

 Depending on the DAISY contents, there may not be any corresponding dividing units.

Changing the character code [Characters]

The character code used to display text can be changed in accordance with the character code of the text file transferred to the [**Text Speech**] folder in the recorder.

[ANSI] [UTF-8] [UTF-16]:

Set in accordance with the displayed text.

Changing the language for reading out text [Text Language]

When the characters in a text file transferred to the [Text Speech] folder in the recorder are not displayed correctly, you can change the character code used to display the text.

[Čeština] [Dansk] [Deutsch] [English] [Español] [Français] [Italiano] [Nederlands] [Polski] [Русский] [Svenska].

Change as required.

NOTE

If the setting for [Voice Guide]
 (ESP. P.99) is [On], [Text Language]

Formatting a recording media [Format]

NOTE

- Never format the voice recorder from a PC.
- Formatting erases all the existing data, including locked files and read-only files
- When the SD card is set to writeprotected, [SD Card Protected] is displayed. To perform formatting, cancel SD card write protection (*P.21).
- When an SD card is inserted in the recorder, be sure to confirm which recording media is to be formatted, [Internal memory] or [SD card], so there is no mistake (** P.82).
- Before formatting, charge or replace the battery to ensure it will not run out before the process is finished. The formatting process can sometimes take over 10 seconds to complete. To prevent the risk of damage to data, never attempt to perform any of the following processes before a formatting process has finished: Doing so may damage the data.
 - 1 Disconnecting the USB-connection AC adapter.
 - 2 Removing the battery.
 - ③ Removing the SD card (if the recording media has been set to [SD card]).

• Even when formatting or erasing (*** P.56) is performed, only the file management information of the internal memory and/or SD card is updated and the recorded data is not completely erased. When disposing of an SD card, be sure to destroy the card, format the card and record silence until the recording time runs out, or perform a similar operation in order to prevent the leakage of personal information.

Wi-Fi Function

Before using the Wi-Fi function

The voice recorder is equipped with a Wi-Fi function. Wi-Fi devices are certified by an organization known as Wi-Fi Alliance that certifies that wireless LAN devices can be mutually connected. In this manual, the wireless LAN functions are described collectively as "Wi-Fi". Smartphones can be connected to the voice recorder using radio signals. Because of wireless, as long as the radio signal can reach the unit, flexible connection is possible. Radio signals extend a certain range and can penetrate obstacles (wood, glass, etc.), thus even if the voice recorder is placed another room, connection is possible. Using a special application for smartphones. you can play back files recorded by the voice recorder. Also, the voice recorder can be operated from a distance, as long as it is within the reach of the radio signal. For details, see our website.

What can you do with the Wi-Fi function?

- Use your smartphone to operate the voice recorder.
- Create content files in which voice and images are synchronized.

To perform the above functions, you need to install the special application for smartphones beforehand (FFP.106).

- If multiple Wi-Fi access points nearby use the same channel, the voice recorder may not be detected correctly.
- To the extent possible, try not to use the voice recorder near mobile phones, televisions, or radios.
 - Mobile phones, PHS, TV sets, and radios use different frequencies than the voice recorder but electromagnetic waves generated from Wi-Fi products including this voice recorder could generate noise in audio or video images.
- When using the Wi-Fi function, battery life is consumed quickly. If the battery runs out during data transfer, the data may be damaged. Therefore, when using a Wi-Fi connection we recommend that you use the AC adapter included with the voice recorder.

Notes on security when using Wi-Fi products

- With a Wi-Fi connection, information is exchanged wirelessly between a smartphone and
 the voice recorder and as long as radio signals reach the unit, flexible connection is possible.
 However, because radio signals can penetrate through obstacles (wood, glass, etc.), if there is
 no security-related setting, the following problems could occur.
 - A malicious third party intentionally intercepts radio signals to spy on communication content.
 - Unauthorized intrusion causes the leaking of personal information.
 - Intercepted communication contents are rewritten and transmitted.
 - Destructive computer viruses are released that can destroy data or systems.

For security protection, we recommend the password be changed periodically using the [**Wi-Fi**] function of the voice recorder (** P.85).

 Should a problem occur for an inevitable reason due to the specifications of the Wi-Fi connection, we assume no responsibility whatsoever for any damage incurred.

TIP

SSID (Service Set Identifier): SSID is the ID (network name) required for Wi-Fi connection. **Access point (Wireless LAN access point):** A device that receives radio signals to connect client to the network over a wireless LAN. Or, the name used when a device is used as only a radio transmitting function.



 continue as long as the voice recorder's LED indicator light is flashing, even if the PC
 data communication screen disappears. Never disconnect the USB connector before
 data communication has finished. Always use the procedure on ™ P.111 to disconnect
 the USB connector. Data may not be transferred correctly if you disconnect the
 connector before the drive has stopped.
- Do not format (initialize) the voice recorder's drive from a PC. Formatting done from a PC will not be done correctly. To perform formatting, use the [Format] menu of the voice recorder (** P.101).
- Voice recorder folders or files that are moved or renamed in a Windows or Macintosh file management screen may be reordered or become unrecognizable.



Functions available in Olympus Sonority

Olympus Sonority provides various functions that can be used to manage and edit files. For information on operating procedures and detailed settings, please refer to the respective items on online help (\mathbb{R}^n P.118).

Waveform editing function

Using the Waveform Editing Function Tab, you can easily process the voice data. In the Waveform Editing Mode, you can also delete unnecessary parts, paste and re-save the data.

One-touch effect function

Using the One-touch Effect Function, you can easily apply special effects to the voice file and carry out noise reduction in any specified area.

Sending files by email

Voice files are stored in the [Message] folder on the hard disk. You can send voice files as attachments to email.

Changing a folder name

You can change a folder name. Up to 62 characters can be entered but the single byte characters of \(\frac{1}{*?"} \) cannot be used.

If folder names are changed in OS of some other language than the languages supported by the voice recorder, the folder name may become garbled.

Editing file comments

You can use Olympus Sonority to add comments to files downloaded from the voice recorder. A maximum of 50 double-byte characters (100 single-byte characters) can be entered.

Changing a file format to another format*

The current saved file format can be changed to other formats.



DAISY is a worldwide accessible information system developed and maintained by the DAISY Consortium, an international collaborative development organization.

What is multimedia DAISY?

Simultaneous viewing of drawings and pictures while listening to audio via a computer. The portion being read is highlighted for easy following. It is also possible to change audio speeds and jump to different pages.

How do you play multimedia DAISY?

Install the Olympus Sonority provided with this recorder (*** P.115), select the [**DAISY**] folder from the browser window and press play to experience multimedia DAISY. During playback, you can skip text and headings, as well as quickly jump to a section by clicking on any sentence. If a bookmark is set in advance, it is also possible to resume playback from that position at any time.





Loading a file to a PC

Recorder care

Exterior

Wipe gently with a soft cloth. If the recorder is very dirty, soak the cloth in mild soapy water and wring well. Wipe the recorder with the damp cloth and then wipe it with a dry cloth.

Monitor

Wipe gently with a soft cloth.

 Do not use benzene, alcohol or other strong solvents, or chemical cleaning cloths.

ME51SW stereo microphone

Has a large-diameter built-in microphone for sensitive stereo recording.

ME30W two-channel microphone (omnidirectional)

Two ME30 monaural microphones come in a set with a miniature tripod and a connection adapter. These highly sensitive omni-directional microphones are supported by plug-in power and are well-suited to recording musical performances.

ME31 compact gun microphone (unidirectional)

A directional gun microphone handy for outdoor recording of wild birds singing and other highly directional applications.

The metal body provides a highly rigid body.

ME34 compact gun microphone (unidirectional)

Comes with an integrated tripod ideal for table placement when recording events from a distance, such as conferences or lectures.

ME33 boundary microphone

A microphone for recording conferences that enables connection of up to three left- and three right-channel units.

Cascade connection enables the left/ right channel connections to be extended up to about 12 meters, to capture sound from a broad range.

ME52W mono microphone (unidirectional)

Designed to record sound from a distance while minimizing the impact of surrounding noise.

ME15 mono tie clip microphone (omnidirectional)

A small, unobtrusive microphone that comes with a tie-clip.

TP8 telephone pickup microphone

An earphone microphone that can be worn in the ear during phone calls. Clearly captures voices and conversations during phone calls.

A514 USB-connection AC adapter

A USB-connected AC adapter that provides 5-volt DC output. (AC100-240V 50/60Hz)

KA333 connecting cord

Important safety precautions

Voice recorder safety precautions



- Do not use the voice recorder in an atmosphere that might contain flammable or explosive gases.
 It may cause fire or explosion.
- Do not attempt to disassemble, repair or modify the voice recorder.
 It may cause electric shock or injury.
- Do not operate the voice recorder while operating a vehicle (such as a bicycle, motorcycle or car).
 It may cause traffic accidents.
- Do not leave the voice recorder in a location accessible to an infant or child.

Pay attention when using the voice recorder near an infant or child, taking care not to leave it unattended. Infants and children are unable to understand voice recorder safety precautions, and are at risk of accidents such as:

- Strangulation caused by accidental entanglement of the earphone cord around the neck
- Operation errors resulting in injury or electric shock.
- Use SD/SDHC/SDXC memory cards only. Never place other types of cards in the voice recorder.

If another card type is placed in the voice recorder by accident, do not try to pull it out by force. Contact an Olympus repair center or service center.

- If the voice recorder is dropped in water or, if water, metal or combustible foreign matter gets inside:
 - 1 Remove the battery immediately.
 - Contact your place of purchase or an Olympus service center for repair. Continued use may result in fire or electric shock
- Do not use the voice recorder or use it only as directed in airplanes, hospitals or other locations where use of electronic devices is restricted.
- Stop using the voice recorder if you notice unusual odor, noise, or smoke coming from it.

It may cause fire or burns. Remove the battery immediately, taking care not to burn yourself. Contact your place of purchase or an Olympus repair center or service center. (Do not touch the battery with bare hands when removing it. Remove the battery outdoors, and away from flammable objects.)

- When carrying the voice recorder by its strap, take care to prevent it becoming caught on other items.
- Do not touch for an extended period of time an energized AC adapter or battery while it is charging.
